Determination¹: Consent granted without condition

Summary of Request and Rationale for Determination:

Greg Feldmann seeks permission to sell the service of teaching a night class on disabilities to undergraduate and graduate students in the College of Education at the University of Iowa (Iowa). This class will be scheduled after Mr. Feldmann's regularly scheduled work hours.

As a public four year postsecondary institution, UI is not regulated by the Iowa Department of Education (IDE), but by the Iowa Board of Regents. However, IDE approves the teacher and administrator preparation programs offered by UI. Mr. Feldmann is not a member of the IDE staff whose responsibility is to review, access, and recommend approval of practitioner preparation programs. Mr. Feldmann's responsibilities include providing supports to LEAs and AEAs in a separate division of IDE and he has no duties that place him in a position of authority over UI.

Therefore, the sale of the service of teaching the aforementioned course for Iowa will not cause Greg Feldmann to advocate on behalf of any entity, does not benefit or prejudice any regulated person or entity, and does not result in a conflict of interest per section 68B.2A.
