Determination¹: Consent granted without condition

Summary of Request and Rationale for Determination:

Stefanie Wager, a social studies education consultant, seeks timely permission to sell the service of designing a poster for and facilitation of the screening of a social studies related film for Professor Brian Beenken at Iowa State University (ISU) in Ames, Iowa.

ISU has a teacher preparation program which is regulated by the Iowa Department of Education (IDE). Otherwise, this agency does not regulate ISU, which is a regent's institution. In her position with the IDE Ms. Wager has no regulatory authority over ISU or any other regent's institution. Ms. Wager will provide this service outside of her regular working hours.

Therefore, the sale of the service of designing a poster for and facilitation of the screening of a social studies related film for ISU will not cause Ms. Wager to advocate on behalf of any entity, does not benefit, or prejudice any regulated person or entity, and does not result in a conflict of interest per section 68B.2A.
