Dear Mr. Smithson:

In accordance with Iowa Code section 68B.4 the Impaired Practitioners Review Committee granted consent for members of the Board to sell or lease goods and services as follows:

1. Members of the Board may sell or lease goods or services to any individual, association, or corporation regulated by any division within the Department of Health, other than the Board on which that official serves. This consent is granted because such sale or lease of goods or services does not affect the Board member's duties or functions on the Board.

2. Members of the Board may sell or lease goods or services to any individual association, or corporation regulated by the Board if those goods or services are routinely provided to the public as part of that person's regular professional practice. This consent is granted because the sale or lease of such goods or services does not affect the Board member's duties or functions on the Board. In the event a complaint is filed with the Board concerning the services or goods provided by the Board member to a member of the public, that Board member is otherwise prohibited by law from participating in any discussion or decision by the Board in that case. See, for example, the Code of Administrative Judicial Conduct, 11 Iowa Administrative Code 10.29(3)(b).

3. Individual application and approval are not required for the sales or leases authorized by this Consent unless there are unique facts surrounding a particular sale or lease which would cause the sale or lease to affect the seller's or lessor's duties or functions on the Board, would give the buyer or lessee an advantage in dealing with the Board, or would otherwise present a conflict of interest as defined in Iowa Code section 68B.2A or the common law.

4. Individual application and approval, when required, shall conform to the procedures and guidelines outlined in 351 Iowa Administrative Code 6.11, and shall only be granted by a majority of a quorum of the Board.



CONSENT TO SALES AND LEASES OF GOODS AND SERVICES

The Professional Licensure Review Committee is created by Iowa Code section 272C.3 subsection (1) "k" for the purpose of evaluating and monitoring licensees who are impaired as a result of alcohol or drug abuse, dependency, or addiction, or by any mental or physical disorder or disability. The Committee is composed of a licensed practitioner who has expertise in the area of substance abuse and addiction treatment, a licensed practitioner who has expertise in the diagnosis and treatment of psychological disorders and disabilities, a specialty board-certified psychiatrist, a licensee who has remained free of addiction for a period of no less than two years since successfully completing a board-approved recovery program, a physician, a physician assistant or an advanced registered nurse practitioner (ARNP) whose specialty area is family practice or who has expertise in neurological disorders, an at-large public member. And the board administrator assigned to the impaired practitioner review committee. Pursuant to Iowa Code section 68B.4 (Supp. 2005), Committee members shall not sell or lease, either directly or indirectly, any goods or services to individuals, associations, or corporations that are subject to the regulatory authority of the Department of Public Health except as authorized by Iowa Code section 68B.4 and the administrative rules adopted by the Iowa Ethics and Campaign Disclosure Committee, 351 Iowa Administrative Code 6.11.

On the 7th day of December, 2006, the Committee granted consent for members of the Committee to sell or lease goods and services as follows:


1. Members of the Committee may sell or lease goods or services to any individual, association, or corporation regulated by any division within the Department of Public Health, other than the Committee on which that official serves. This consent is granted because such sale or lease of goods or services does not affect the Committee member's duties or functions on the Committee.

2. Members of the Committee may sell or lease goods or services to any individual association, or corporation regulated by the Committee if those goods or services are routinely provided to the public as part of that person's regular professional practice. This consent is granted because the sale or lease of such goods or services does not affect the Committee member's duties or functions on the Committee. In the event a complaint is filed with the Committee concerning the services or goods provided by the Committee member to a member of the public, that Committee member is otherwise prohibited by law from participating in any discussion or decision by the Committee in that case. See, for example, the Code of Administrative Judicial Conduct, 11 Iowa Administrative Code 10.29(3)(b).

3. Individual application and approval are not required for the sales or leases authorized by this Consent unless there are unique facts surrounding a particular sale or lease which would cause the sale or lease to affect the seller's or lessor's duties or functions on the Committee, would give the buyer or lessee an advantage in dealing with the Committee, or would otherwise present a conflict of interest as defined in Iowa Code section 68B.2A or the common law.

4. Individual application and approval, when required, shall conform to the procedures and guidelines outlined in 351 Iowa Administrative Code 6.11, and shall only be granted by a majority of a quorum of the Committee.
